

## HOLIDAYS HOME WORK for Summer Break

### CLASS- VI (ENGLISH)

1. Holidays are your chance to look after your parents, spending a lot of time with them. In these holidays, sit with your grandparents, ask about their schools, type of games they used to play, share their stories of childhood, what type of relationship they shared with their parents. Prepare a report/write-up based on your talks with your grandparents. Click few fun photographs with them and paste those photographs as well in a scrap book.
2. Students will read the prescribed book for extensive reading in the holidays. After reading all the stories of Arabian Nights, they will write the review of any one story which they like the most. Moreover they will write the character sketch of any one character from the story which they like the best.

These holidays homework are to be done strictly in a separate scrap book in a very creative manner.

### CLASS- VII (ENGLISH)

1. Read the novel 'Great Expectations' by Charles Dickens. Write the summary of the novel in about 100-150 words. Also describe about two of your favourite characters with pictures in a scrap book.
2. Reading of newspaper is a good and useful habit. Develop the habit of reading newspaper during this summer vacation and enrich your vocabulary. Also listen to the English news channels to keep yourself informed and up-to-date

### CLASS- VIII (ENGLISH)

1. Read any four stories from the book 'More Tales from Shakespeare' and **write a review** on any one of the stories in a scrap book beautifully decorated with the pictures of the book cover, writer, characters and scenes related to the story.

Follow the guidelines for writing a book review:

- About the author.
- Main characters.
- What is the story about?
- What is the plot?
- Who is your favourite character?
- What is your favourite part of the book?

2. Design a poster on any one of the following topics on A-3 size sheet.

1. Changing face of the Earth
2. Smart city
3. Human Welfare
4. Cleanliness is next to Godliness
5. Moral Values and Lifestyle
6. Plant in the Desert

Guidelines for the poster:

- Write a catchy slogan or caption for the poster with clear theme.

- Ensure that your poster is bright, colourful and attractive.
- Make sketches or simple drawings.
- Use appropriate and accurate language to convey the message.
- Present your creativity in terms of content and design.
